Young Anglican Scholarships 2018

Are you called to spend one year in a radical Jesus-centered community of prayer, study and serving local communities? In 2018 we will be offering four contestable scholarships for an extraordinary, year-long residential experience.

Are you wanting to do something for God? Get some deeper insights into the Bible, theology, God, mission, yourself and others...and get your hands 'dirty'? Then maybe this is for you!

What is involved?

- Engage in a rhythm of prayer and a rule of life on the St John's Theological College campus in Meadowbank, Auckland
- Mentoring by a faculty member where, on a weekly basis, you will share your lives and journey with each other during term time
- To study for the NZQA Diploma in Christian Studies at Level 5 (equivalent to first year university). Here you will join other students of the College. These papers can be cross-credited into some degrees
- Missional engagement weekly and a mission experience for seven to ten days, mid-year, possibly in Polynesia
- We will be working within the focus of the Graduate Profile offered, in pictorial form, at the end of this document.

What is offered?

- Full accommodation in a flatting-type arrangement with nearby oversight of a senior student or faculty member
- Lunches each weekday during term time
- Payment of tuition fees
- A living allowance equivalent to Study Link, along with a book allowance
- Cost of General Practitioner visits

Who is eligible?

Single Anglican men and women between the ages of 18 & 25 who:

- have a desire to invest in their spiritual growth
- are supported by their Vicar or School Chaplain and their Bishop/Pihopa
- are able to contribute \$1200 towards an overseas mission experience
- are able to pay your costs to and from Auckland.

What happens at the end of 2018?

During the latter months of your time at the College we will explore the all-important question of 'Where to from here?'

There are a variety of options depending on what we at the College, your bishop and you discern, but they might include:

- Returning to your home diocese, energised and better equipped for mission and ministry in that place. This will be the usual track
- Entering into your diocese's discernment processes, perhaps for ordination, and so you may stay on at College to study for a degree like the BTheol through Otago University or Laidlaw College
- Stay on at the College, but enter into some form of vocational training as a lay person in say law, accountancy, teaching, social work or similar to better resource the Church. This would also require full endorsement by your bishop and be dependent on the availability of accommodation
- In the case of the latter two options a separate application process through your diocese would be required.
